WORLD DAY OF MIGRANTS AND REFUGEES

On **Sunday 27 September** the Catholic Church celebrates the World Day of Migrants and Refugees. For the theme of his message this year, Pope Francis chose **Like Jesus Christ, Forced to Flee**, calling us to see the face of God in migrants and refugees. He also made a special appeal for the world's 45.7 million internally displaced people.

To mark the day, Bishop Paul McAleenan was joined in conversation by Archbishop Nizar of Hadiyah-Erbil dioceses in Iraq, Sarah Teather, Director of the Jesuit Refugee Service, Ben from 'Refugees Call for Change' and Brother Johannes Maertens who spent many years helping refugees at **The Jungle** camp in Calais. Bishop McAleenan is the Lead Bishop for Migrants and Refugees for the Catholic Bishops' Conference of England and Wales. The discussion covered the current challenges facing refugees in the UK, Europe and around the world in light of the Pope's message. The participants also explored practical steps that Catholics can take to support our refugee sisters and brothers. NHS COVID-19 APP

The NHS COVID-19 App is **free** and was available to download from **Thursday 24 September**. As a parish, we are requested to display a **QR code** to facilitate use of this NHS service to parishioners. This will be displayed in an easily accessible place in each of our churches from this weekend. As use of the App is voluntary, Scarborough Parishes will continue to maintain our current system, whereby individuals give their name(s) to the stewards when entering the premises, and fill in a Test & Trace form if they are not on our Register of Attendees.

What the app does:

Trace – get alerted if you have been near other App users who have tested positive for Covid-19

Alert – lets you know the level of Covid-19 risk in your postcode district

Check-in – get alerted if you have visited a venue where you may have come into contact with the Covid-19 virus

Symptoms – check if you have coronavirus symptoms and see if you need to order a free test

Test – helps you book a test and get your result quickly

Isolate – keep track of your self-isolation countdown and access relevant advice

How to use QR codes to check into a venue

User guide *This user guide will be displayed at all our churches next to the scannable QR code*

1

Download the NHS COVID-19 app from the App Store or Google Play Store.

2

When you visit a venue, check to see if there is a NHS COVID-19 app QR poster on display.

3

Open your NHS COVID-19 app and tap "Venue Check In". Now use your smartphone camera to scan the QR code on the poster.

4

The time and date of your visit will be stored on the app. It will not be sent or shared with anyone else.

5

After scanning your QR code on the poster, you are now successfully checked in.

6

If you go to another venue, open your NHS COVID-19 app and tap "Venue Check In". Now use your smartphone camera to scan their QR poster.

7

You may get an alert if NHS contact tracers identify that you have recently visited a venue where you may have come into contact with coronavirus (COVID-19). If you are under 18, you are advised to show this alert to a trusted adult.

8

If you develop coronavirus (COVID-19) symptoms, make sure to record them in the NHS COVID-19 app and follow Government guidelines/advice.
