POPE FRANCIS' ROSARY MISSION



The Holy Father has invited the entire Universal Church to participate in a great Rosary Mission to plead before the throne of God for an end to the coronavirus pandemic and for the healing for the wounds this pandemic has caused in the hearts of individuals, families and nations. **Press Release** from the Congregation for the promotion of the New Evangelisation (21 April): At the Heart of the Holy Father's wish, the month of May will be dedicated to a marathon of prayer from the theme, *From the whole Church the prayer to God went up incessantly (Act 12,5)*. The initiative will involve in a special way all the Sanctuaries of the World, so that they become promoters to the faithful, families and communities of the recitation of the Rosary to invoke the end of the Pandemic. Thirty representative Shrines, scattered all over the world, will



guide the Marian prayer, which will be broadcast live on the official channels of the Holy See at 6pm (Rome time) every evening. **Pope Francis will open this great prayer on 1 May and end it on 31 May** with a Rosary broadcast across Vatican Media's platforms.

In conjunction with the Rosary Mission of the Holy Father, the Rosary Movement of Reparation (formerly Rosary on the Coast), under the umbrella of the National Shrine and Basilica of Our Lady, Walsingham, invites us all to unite in their May 2021 Rosary Stronghold Mission and pray the Holy Rosary for the following intentions:

- Protecting our families and the family of nations, especially in this Year of St Joseph
- A deepening of faith, hope and love and the protection of life
- Peace in the world
- Deliverance from Coronavirus; for those working for a cure; those who have died; those who are suffering and those who care for them

As the month of May goes forward, we will CRY OUT with Pope Francis with ever-greater intensity before the Throne of GOD for our pleadings to be heard! We participate in this Rosary Mission in the light of the recent Rededication of England as the Dowry of Mary on 29 March 2020, the Consecration of Scotland to the Immaculate Heart of Mary on 3 September 2017 and ongoing intercession for Wales.

- **DAILY ONLINE ROSARY AT 8PM from Sat 1 May** led from led from a different Parish/Shrine in the UK (see left)
- **Mon 24 May:** Rosary Day for Schools & Young People to pray and intercede for the Mission and Intentions of our Schools, Youth Associations/Groups/Projects, our Young People and for Families
- **Sun 30 May:** National Rosary Relay Rally led by each Diocese to intercede for the Rosary Mission intentions and for the needs of their particular Diocese. The designated Rosary Hour for the Diocese of Middlesbrough for the National Rosary Relay Rally on Sunday 30 May is from 7pm to 8pm.
- **Mon 31 May:** Online Rosary with Bishop John Keenan, who will host a Crowning Rosary online at 8pm, in thanksgiving for the graces received from the Lord Jesus through the powerful intercession of Our Lady of the Rosary during the 2021 Rosary Mission.
