PLENARY INDULGENCE FOR THE JUBILEE YEAR OF HOPE 2025

As part of the Jubilee Year 2025, Catholics are encouraged to gain a Plenary Indulgence.

WHAT IS A PLENARY INDULGENCE? A plenary indulgence is a grace granted by the Church that removes all

temporal punishment due to sins that have already been forgiven in Confession. The Church offers the plenary

indulgence as an extraordinary gift of mercy to all pilgrims, helping them reflect on God's infinite forgiveness. In celebration of the Jubilee Year 2025, under the theme "Pilgrims of Hope," the Holy Father, Pope Leo, has granted a special plenary indulgence to all faithful pilgrims who visit designated sanctuaries, including the Catholic National Shrine and Basilica of Our Lady, at Walsingham.

CONDITIONS FOR RECEIVING THE JUBILEE YEAR INDULGENCE:

- 1. Receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession) within a few days before or after the pilgrimage, or during the pilgrimage itself.
- 2. Attend Holy Mass and participate in the celebration of the Holy Eucharist and receive Holy Communion.
- 3. Pray for the intentions of the Pope, typically including an Our Father, Hail Mary, and Glory Be.
- 4. Have a spirit of detachment from sin, even venial sin.
- 5. Make a pilgrimage to designated Pilgrimage site as a "Pilgrim of Hope" during the Jubilee Year.

WHY PILGRIMS SHOULD TAKE ADVANTAGE OF THE JUBILEE INDULGENCE?

- 1. Spiritual Renewal: The indulgence provides a unique opportunity for deep spiritual renewal and reconciliation. By receiving the indulgence, pilgrims can experience complete forgiveness of the temporal effects of their past sins, allowing them to draw closer to God.
- 2. Pilgrimage of Hope: As "Pilgrims of Hope," you are invited to embark on a journey of faith and renewal. The indulgence symbolizes hope in God's boundless mercy and love, offering a fresh start on your spiritual path.
- 3. A Gift of Mercy: The Church offers the plenary indulgence as an extraordinary gift of mercy to all pilgrims, helping them reflect on God's infinite forgiveness. It is a time to strengthen your relationship with Christ and to prepare your soul for eternal life.
- 4. Prayers for Others: Pilgrims can also choose to apply the indulgence to the souls of the faithful departed, offering them the grace of purification and entrance into eternal life with God.

Finally, the Jubilee Year indulgence for 2025 is a special invitation to all pilgrims to renew their faith, receive the fullness of God's mercy, and become true "Pilgrims of Hope." It is an unparalleled opportunity to experience spiritual freedom and a deeper communion with Christ and His Church during this sacred time.

WHAT IS A PILGRIMAGE? A pilgrimage is a religious journey to a holy place or site. Pilgrims embark on such journeys for various reasons: to offer God thanks, seek healing, fulfil a promise, or simply draw closer to God. In this Jubilee Year, the faithful are encouraged to make such journeys not only with physical steps but with the heart and mind open to God's grace. By walking this path of hope, we align ourselves with Mary, who through her yes to God became the model for all Christian pilgrims.

KEY PILGRIMAGE SITES IN THE UK: National Shrine of Our Lady at Walsingham, Cathedrals of St John the Baptist, Norwich; St David's Cathedral, Cardiff; St Chad's Cathedral, Birmingham; Shrine of St Chad in Lichfield; St Barnabas' Cathedral, Nottingham; and various churches and cathedrals across the UK: Each diocese has designated local sites and shrines, offering options for local pilgrimages. St Peter's Church is one of them. Others include St Wilfred's in York, St Charles Borromeo Church in Hull, Ampleforth Abbey, St Mary's Cathedral in Middlesbrough, and the Lady Chapel at Osmotherley

NATIONAL JUBILEE PILGRIMAGE OF HOPE: This is a national walking pilgrimage with four main Ways (see below) converging at the Cathedral of St Barnabas, Nottingham, on Saturday 13 September 2025, for shared prayer and celebration. The Pilgrimage will culminate with Solemn Mass for the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross at 11:15 am on Sunday, 14 September 2025 at St Barnabas' Cathedral. The Pilgrimage will embody the values of the Sisters of the Holy Cross of compassion, faith, prayer and community. The four main Ways start at the Catholic cathedrals in Cardiff, Leeds, Norwich and London, and will bless our nations with a Sign of the Cross and with the Gospels. The routes use established

hiking routes and are off road as much as possible. A small group of *perpetual pilgrims* will walk the full distance of each Way, and day pilgrims will be able to register to join for stages. St Mark's Way (North): The northern Way from Leeds Cathedral to St Barnabas' Cathedral in Nottingham via St Marie's Cathedral in Sheffield and the Chapel of the Padley Martyrs.

St Luke's Way (East): The eastern Way from the Cathedral Church of St John the Baptist in Norwich to the Cathedral Church of St Barnabas in Nottingham via the National Shrine of Our Lady at Houghton St Giles and the Pontifical Shrine of Our Lady of Walsingham at King's Lynn.

St John's Way (South): The southern Way from Southwark and Westminster Cathedrals in London to St Barnabas' Cathedral in Nottingham via the Cathedral of Our Lady Immaculate and St Thomas of Canterbury in Northampton.

St Matthew's Way (West): The western Way from St David's Cathedral in Cardiff to St Barnabas' Cathedral in Nottingham via St Chad's Cathedral in Birmingham and the Shrine of St Chad in Lichfield.

DAY OF SPECIAL PRAYER FOR EUROPE is this Wednesday 23 July, Feast Day of St Bridget of Sweden. In the Catholic tradition, there isn't one single, universally designated "special day of prayer for Europe". However, there are several occasions throughout the year when the Church specifically prays for the continent, its people, and its challenges. These follow the Liturgical Cycle of Prayer and coincide with Feast Days of European Saints, including St Cyril and St Methodius on February 14th, St Catherine of Siena on April 29th, St Benedict on July 11th, St Bridget of Sweden on July 23rd, and St Teresa Benedicta of the Cross (Edith Stein) on August 9th.
