



THE NATIVITY OF OUR LADY



The Feast of the Nativity of Our Lady falls on 8 September. This image of the Nativity of Our Lady by Spanish artist Bartolomé Esteban Murillo (1617-1682) was painted for the Chapel of the Immaculate Conception in Seville Cathedral. It now hangs in the Louvre, Paris. The image clearly illustrates the holiness of Mary's state at birth, being free from original sin from the moment of her conception. To the left of the image Mary's mother, St Anne, rests after giving birth with her husband, St Joachim by her side, while a midwife tends to the newly born Mary in the centre of the image, and Andalusian peasant helpers and angelic beings look on in wonder.

The Blessed Virgin Mary occupied a unique role in the history of salvation. It was through her generous "fiat" (yes) (Be it done to me according to thy Word), that God's plan of salvation was fulfilled, and His Son, Our Lord Jesus, was made flesh and came into the world. Mary was prepared for this mission, the highest ever extolled by God upon one of his creatures, through her Immaculate Conception, and it is for this reason, heaven and earth rejoice at the birth of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Sacred Scripture does not give an account of Mary's birth. However, the early second century Protoevangelium of James records that St Joachim (believed to be a wealthy member of the Twelve Tribes of Israel) and St Anne were grieved by their barrenness and prayed to God for a child. Their prayers were granted, but with the promise that the child would commence God's plan of salvation. The Protoevangelium of James is not canonical but provides a source for the development of Christian piety. Today's Feast possibly originated in Syria or Palestine in the beginning of the 6th century. After the Council of

After the Council of Ephesus in **AD 431**, devotion to the mother of God was greatly intensified, especially in Syria. A September birth was probably chosen because the Eastern Church begins its Church year in September. The date of 8 September helped determine the date for the feast of the Immaculate Conception on 8 December.

Celebrating the birthday of Our Mother: Display and image of Our Lady in your home and light a candle. Give her a gift of some flowers and some words of love and affection. Visit the Shrine at St Peter's Grotto after Mass on the feast day and pray the Rosary or the Prayer on the wall. Let us be close to Mary and call upon her help and ask her to pray for us, that we may be united with her Son, Our Lord Jesus Christ. Let us thank God for giving us the Blessed Virgin Mary as the mother of Our Lord Jesus Christ and as our mother, and thank Our Lady for her selfless, generous love and self-giving (Behold the handmaid of the Lord) in carrying out God's Will, thereby cooperating in the redemption of the human race.

Let us celebrate with joy the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary, for from her arose the sun of justice, Christ our God.

MINISTERS OF THE WORD & EXTRA-ORDINARY MINISTERS OF HOLY COMMUNION

These are the **correct terms for our Ministers** - not Readers and not Eucharistic Ministers or Special Ministers. The word *minister* comes from the Latin minister, meaning *servant* or *attendant*. In Catholic theology, readers are called **Ministers of the Word** because they don't just read scripture; they act as instruments through whom God's living Word is proclaimed to the assembly as a form of service and a vital part of the liturgy. This title reflects the sacred nature of the role in conveying God's message and helping nourish the faith of the community. Special ministers are called **Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion** because bishops, priests, and deacons are the Ordinary Ministers of the Eucharist (meaning it is part of their regular, ordained duties). Extraordinary ministers are laypersons who are deputed to assist the Ordinary Ministers, or are called upon when the number of communicants or other circumstances make it necessary. The term *extraordinary* highlights their *supplementary* role in facilitating the distribution of communion.
