DIVINE OFFICE: Week 1

99TH WORLD MISSION SUNDAY

World Mission Sunday began in 1926. It was added as a Feast by Pope Pius X1. The Papal Message was written by the late Pope Francis early in the year. A summary of his message is below. More recently, **Pope Leo XIV** issued a video message **calling on every Catholic parish to take part in World Mission Sunday**. World Mission Sunday is held every year on the second-to-last Sunday of October. This year it will take place **on 19 October** with the theme of "Missionaries of Hope among the peoples." On World Mission Sunday the whole Church prays, united, particularly for missionaries and the fruitfulness of their apostolic labours. Pope Leo said "When I served as a missionary priest and Bishop in Peru, I saw first-hand how the faith, the prayer and the generosity shown on World Mission Sunday can transform entire communities."

MESSAGE OF THE LATE POPE FRANCIS FOR THE 99TH WORLD MISSION DAY 2025 (SUMMARY)

Missionaries of Hope Among All Peoples: The theme Pope Francis chose for this year's World Mission Day in this Jubilee Year 2025, is a theme of hope: "Missionaries of Hope Among All Peoples" (cf. Spes Non Confundit 1). This theme reminds all baptised Christians of our vocation to follow Christ and become messengers of hope in a world overshadowed by despair (cf. Fratelli Tutti, 9–55). Rooted in the resurrection, we are born anew "to a living hope" (1 Peter 1:3–4), and invited to rekindle missionary zeal through the Spirit.

In the Footsteps of Christ, Our Hope: We keep our gaze on Christ, who is the centre of history, "the same yesterday and today and forever" (Hebrews 13:8). In the synagogue of Nazareth, Jesus declared that the fulfilment of Scripture was fulfilled in the "today" of his presence (Luke 4:16–21). He thus revealed that He is the One sent by the Father with the anointing of the Holy Spirit to proclaim the Good News of the Kingdom of God and to inaugurate "the year of the Lord's favour" for all humanity (cf. Lk 4:16-21).

In this mystic "today", which will last until the end of the world, Christ is the fullness of salvation for all, and in a particular way for those whose only hope is God. His earthly ministry - "doing good and healing all" from evil and the Evil One (Acts 10:38). He restored hope to the afflicted. Even in suffering, Jesus trusted the Father's plan, a future "full of hope" (Jeremiah 29:11), becoming the divine Missionary of hope. This mission continues through his disciples, sent to all peoples. Christ still draws near to the poor and suffering, offering "the balm of consolation and the wine of hope." The Church, though imperfect, perseveres in this mission, impelled by Christ's love and united with his compassion. She is called to be "a missionary Church that walks with her Lord through the streets of the world" (Synod Homily, 27 Oct 2024).

Christians as Bearers and Builders of Hope: Christians are called to share the Good News by engaging with the real-life struggles of others. As Gaudium et Spes affirms, "the joys and hopes, the grief and anguish of the people of our time... are the joys and hopes... of the followers of Christ" (GS 1). Missionaries' ad gentes exemplify this call, responding to Christ's command to "make disciples of all nations" (Matthew 28:18–20).

Living God's Style: Closeness and Compassion: The most "developed" areas of the world, show serious symptoms of human crisis: a widespread sense of bewilderment, loneliness and indifference to the needs of the elderly, and a reluctance to make an effort to assist our neighbours in need. In the most technologically advanced nations, "proximity" is disappearing: we are all interconnected, but not related. Obsession with efficiency and an attachment to material things and ambitions are making us self-centred and incapable of altruism. The Gospel, experienced in the life of a community, can restore us to a whole, healthy, redeemed humanity.

The Jubilee invites us to embody God's "*style*"—closeness, compassion, and tenderness (cf. Evangelii Gaudium, 127–128). Through personal relationships, we communicate the love of Christ's heart, "*the very core of the initial preaching of the Gospel*" (Dilexit Nos, 32). Drawing from this source, we share the hope we've received (1 Peter 1:21), offering others the same comfort God has given us (2 Corinthians 1:3–4).

Renewing the Mission of Hope: In today's world, Christ's disciples are urgently called to become "artisans" of hope, restoring joy and meaning to a distracted and weary humanity. This renewal begins with Easter spirituality, especially through the Eucharist and the Easter Triduum, which celebrate our baptism into Christ's death and resurrection—our entry into the eternal springtime of history. As "springtime people," we proclaim that death and hatred are not the final word (cf. Catechesis, 23 Aug 2017).

From the paschal mysteries and sacraments, we draw strength from the Holy Spirit to evangelize with zeal and patience. "*Christ, risen and glorified, is the wellspring of our hope*" and equips us for the mission he entrusts to us (Evangelii Gaudium, 275). This hope is both a divine gift and a Christian responsibility (Hope is a Light in the Night, 2024, 7).

Missionaries of hope are rooted in prayer. As Cardinal Van Thuan affirmed, "the person who hopes is a person who prays," sustained even in suffering by prayer and the Eucharist (cf. The Road of Hope, 963). Prayer is the Church's primary missionary activity and "the first strength of hope" (Catechesis, 20 May 2020).

Renewing this mission begins with prayer grounded in Scripture, especially the Psalms—composed by the Holy Spirit—which teach us to hope in adversity and long for God's praise among all peoples (cf. Ps 41:12; 67:4). Prayer ignites the spark of hope within us, inspiring concrete acts of love and service. Evangelization is a communal journey, like hope itself (cf. Spe Salvi, 14). It continues beyond Baptism, requiring ongoing formation and accompaniment. Missionary activity is central to the Church's life (Evangelii Gaudium, 15), supported by synodality and the Pontifical Mission Societies.
