31ST RACIAL JUSTICE SUNDAY

WHAT IS AN APOSTOLIC ADMINISTRATOR

We welcome **Bishop Marcus Stock, Bishop of Leeds, to his new role as the Apostolic Administrator of our Diocese of Middlesbrough**, and we support him in our prayers and encouragement as he takes up this new ministry. **Prayer cards** are available at the back of all our churches. There will no doubt be a number of questions in relation to his new role. Here are the answers, provided by the diocese, to answer some common questions:

There are numerous **different types of Apostolic Administrator**, however in our situation an Apostolic Administrator is a priest or a bishop who has been **appointed by the Pope to govern a diocese when the Diocesan Bishop retires, resigns or dies**. This is different from a Diocesan Administrator who is chosen by the College of Consultors (Chapter of Canons) to govern the diocese on a temporary basis until a new Diocesan Bishop is chosen by the Pope. He governs the diocese for as long as the Pope wishes.

How is it different from a Diocesan Bishop? For all intents and purposes **an Apostolic Administrator is like the Diocesan Bishop**, he has all the rights and responsibilities of the Diocesan Bishop, however he exercises his office based on the mandate given to him by the Pope. Bishop Marcus does not formally have the title as the Bishop of the Middlesbrough, but he has all the rights and responsibilities the Bishop of Middlesbrough would have.

What does this mean for the Diocese? The Diocese of Middlesbrough continues to function as a separate Diocese, as it did under Bishop Terry Drainey. **This does not mean that we are immediately merged with the Diocese of Leeds**. It is like two parishes which share a priest, both remain as they were before. It does mean that Bishop Marcus will divide his time between Middlesbrough Diocese and Leeds Diocese so there may be some practical changes to allow him to minister to both dioceses.


What does it mean for Bishop Terry? Bishop Terry retired last December from his role as Diocesan Bishop, with immediate effect, and becomes an **emeritus bishop** of the diocese, like Bishop John Crowley.

How should we refer to Bishop Marcus at Mass and in the Liturgy? At the points in the Mass and Divine Office where it asks for us to name our bishop use the formula "**Marcus, our Bishop**". Likewise in intercessions at Mass alongside praying for the Holy Father and the Church we should pray for Bishop Marcus.

Will there be a Mass of Installation? No, there is no need for Bishop Marcus to be installed as he assumed his office from the moment the Holy Father appointed him. However, there will be a Mass to formally welcome Bishop Marcus to the Diocese at some point in the future.

When will we know more about how this arrangement will work? It is very early to know how a lot of things will work practically for this new situation, especially as Bishop Marcus remains Bishop of Leeds with all his responsibilities for that role, overtime things will become a lot clearer how the diocese will continue to function and what the future will hold for both the dioceses of Middlesbrough and Leeds.

A SHORT PROFILE OF BISHOP MARCUS STOCK (65 years) He was born 27 August 1961 in London. He studied in Rome Ordained Deacon by the late Cardinal Hume and ordained priest 1988 by Cardinal Nichols. He served as priest in some parishes the archdiocese of Birmingham. He became 10th Bishop of Leed 2014.
