GUIDANCE FOR RESUMPTION OF CELEBRATION OF PUBLIC MASS FROM BISHOP DRAINEY

AS ISSUED BY THE BISHOPS' CONFERENCE OF ENGLAND & WALES

The Government announced that from **4 July 2020 communal acts of worship** will be allowed in our Churches, where safety procedures are already in place for private prayer, overseen by volunteer stewards.

SOCIAL DISTANCING - IMPORTANT: The Government maintains that **2m social distancing** requirements should be applied wherever possible. Face masks are **compulsory** and "1m plus" in situations where this is not possible. **Try to arrive early** for Mass to avoid congestion.

BEFORE MASS

- **Only those necessary** are permitted in the sacristy before (or after) Mass
- Everything should be prepared for the celebration of Mass with great care, especially Holy Communion
- There should be a separate ciborium/paten for each Minister of Holy Communion. The priest should prepare his own.
- The purificator and any towels should be used only once and then laundered.

DURING MASS

- **Hymn books** are to be removed. There should be **no singing** until further notice
- Single use worship aids (*Missalettes*) are permitted but should be **taken with you** when you leave and not be left in church
- The **Holy Water** stoups should be **dry**.
- The priest should remain socially distant at all times on the sanctuary.
- There should be **no offertory procession**. The gifts of bread and wine should be already be in place before Mass begins
- The homily should be brief and **bidding prayers omitted**, to minimise the time people are congregated
- Members of the congregation **should not exchange** the Sign of Peace
- No collection should take place during Mass. **Collecting boxes will be placed at the door and overseen by stewards**
- The **collection** should be consolidated into sealed plastic bags, placed into a secure location and **left 72 hours** before counting
- **Counters** should wear gloves when doing this task and the area should be well ventilated and cleaned before and afterwards.

THE RECEIVING OF HOLY COMMUNION

- The priest should receive Holy Communion under both kinds using **his own** Host and Chalice, then sanitise his hands
- Holy Communion will be distributed under one kind only
- The **People's Communion** should be distributed **in silence** with no dialogue between minister and communicant
- A **physical barrier** should be placed, to socially distance the priest from communicants
- People to **wait in their pews** until instructed by the Stewards to move forward, maintaining social distancing
- **The priest is permitted to distribute Holy Communion after the FINAL Blessing and Dismissal, and communicants will leave the Church immediately after receiving – this is the method we will adopt at St Peter's**
- When approaching the priest, hold your arms out "**full stretch,**" **palms upwards**, one of top of the other, flatly as possible

AFTER THE CELEBRATION OF MASS

- All altar linens and towels should be placed into a receptacle for laundry
- All sacred vessels should be **washed in hot water** with a little neutral soap and dried completely before storing.
- Parishioners should be encouraged to return home and not remain. If clergy wish to greet people, they must remove their vestments first and avoid physical contact.
- Any discarded printed materials should be removed and bagged for disposal
- The church should be closed after the Mass and should be properly sanitised, as per guidelines for private prayer

RESUMPTION OF CONFESSIONS SATURDAY 11JULY 10.45AM - 1PM AT ST PETERS CHURCH
Confessions resume next Saturday with the **Filey Priests helping**, conducted in as safe a way as possible, through physical distance or barriers, and sanitising kneelers or chairs between uses. The use of traditional confessionals should be avoided, due to restricted airflow. Penitents should observe the safety regulations when doing penance. **Observe safety procedures and signs while in church and wear a face mask. (MAKE YOUR WAY TO SIDE ALTAR).** Be brief.

REOPENING OF ST PETERS FOR WEEKEND AND DAILY MASS. Pay attention to the guidelines on the front page of the newsletter. **Sunday Collection** to comply safety regulations will at the exit, and will be overseen by a steward.

POLISH MASS RESUMES Sunday 12 July 9.30am. Their team to sanitise the church *after* Mass before 11.30am Mass
VOLUNTEERS NEEDED to act as **Stewards** before, during and after Masses, and during Adoration and Confession times. Please **sign-up** for "shifts" on the available sheet. **IMPORTANT:** Mass can only be held if we can comply to the regulations, including sufficient Stewards & Sanitisers. *All volunteers please ensure you adhere to the safety instructions and maintain prayerful silence* inside the church. **A BIG THANK YOU** to all have given their time so far to enable our church to reopen. In accordance with NHS Test & Trace rules, your details will be used only by them in the event of an outbreak, kept for 21 days and then destroyed.
